# CÔTES DE BORDEAUX

# 10 years tasting

he 2019 vintage saw Côtes de Bordeaux celebrating ten years since its creation back in 2008, and its first official appearance on labels with the 2009 wines.

It means 10 years since the AOC Côtes de Bordeaux has brought together the winemakers of Blaye, Cadillac, Castillon, Francs and now St Foy, making sense of their common approach to producing deliciously fruity, unfussy, affordable wines that almost invariably have real families behind them, winemakers that live onsite in their estates and work outside in their own vineyards or in their cellars every day. One in every 10 bottles of Bordeaux is from the Côtes, and the last 10 years have seen names like Châteaux Biac, Réaut, Joanin-Bécot, Clos Puy Arnaud and Puygureaud establish just what incredible quality that can be achieved here year after year.

The five sub-appellations that make up the Côtes are largely red wine producers – around 97% of bottles are made up of various mixes of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Petit Verdot – each with their own specificities and signatures, from the | either in person or through its bottles limestone and clay soils of Francs, St Foy and Castillon to the more gravel-rich stretches of Blaye and Cadillac. And there are also some excellent dry white wines that you can find, made up usually of Sauvignon Blanc and Sémillon, some with touches of Sauvignon Gris or Muscadelle, and even a few stickies (Francs is unusual in Bordeaux for being able to produce reds, dry whites and sweet wines all in the same AOC).

And there are always some brilliant anomalies to look out for – so 100% Cabernet Sauvignon over at Château Pilet's Alt 120 Metres bottling from Jean Queyrens in Cadillac, for one, or the fascinating new project that is being undertaken at Ad Francos in Francs, where wine has been made since the 11th century and where today Guillaume Brochard is working with Michel Rolland to set new quality standards. The property was in the Rolland family for several hundred years, with Michel Rolland's father being born on the site, making this a particularly personal consultancy for him. The Côtes is full of these stories, and richly rewards a visit

back at home.

And fittingly for the 10th year tasting, there were plenty of excellent wines on offer, made it very difficult to take the wines down from over 210 tasted to just 120 selected here. I was looking at examples from three years, with 2016, 2017 and some freshly bottled 2018s all of offer. Because of the overall strength of the entries, there were plenty of wines that would make very enjoyable early drinking bottles that were not able to be included, so do think about trying the Côtes in these vintages when you see them, even ones that are not named here.

I would particularly recommend these wines in 2016, as it was an exceptional vintage and it was extremely impressive how many good wines were available at accessible prices. The oak was perhaps a little more evident in 2017 than in 2016, because the fruit is less intense and concentrated, but as many of these wines are made to drink young, that is less of an issue than in wines you might want to put away for a few years. What is certain is that so many of these Côtes styles are perfect for food, and are made for sharing.



# Wines to try **WHITES**

BLAYE CÔTES DE BORDEAUX

### Domaine des Graves d'Ardonneau **Prestige 2017** 90

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Good focus and lift to the flavours. Citrus, apricot, white pear, touches of gunsmoke. Still appealingly soft and easy to drink, but with good character. **Drink** 2019-2023 **Alc** 12.5%

### Château La Bretonnière Tradition **2017** 89

50% Sauvignon Blanc, 30% Sémillon. 20% Sauvignon Gris. Attractive and carefully placed white flowers and pear on the nose, a little less impact through the palate but this is appealing and juicy, with a candy floss sweet twist on the finish. **Drink** 2019-2023 **Alc** 13%

# Château La Raz Caman 2018 89

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Clear Sauvignon Blanc grassy edges on the nose, this has appealing focus, particularly for the price. A sweetness underneath the freshness brings balance, and a good texture. **Drink** 2019-2023 **Alc** 12.5%

### Château Le Grand Moulin 2018 89

87% Sauvignon Blanc, 10% Sémillon, 3% Muscadelle. Fairly high aromatics, apricot blossom and white peach. Silky texture, this has grip and a sense of focus, acidity a touch tart on the finish but overall one of the best in the lineup, especially for the price. **Drink** 2019-2023

# FRANCS CÔTES DE BORDEAUX

### Château Puygueraud 2017 92 £17.50 Seckford

85% Sauvignon Blanc, 15% Sauvignon Gris. Pale crisp colour, very attractive, well placed fruits and clear minerality, white peaches, fleshy pear, good grip and persistently. Very good. Drink 2019-2023 **Alc** 13%

# Château Claribès 2018 91

£15 Claribes Ltd

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Sauvignon Blanc seems to have succeeded well in 2018. This is good, has a lovely bright feel, some stone fruits and minerality, and a good lift. **Drink** 2019-2023 **Alc** 14.5%

# Château de Grangeneuve 2018 90

65% Sauvignon Blanc, 30% Sémillon, 5% Muscadelle. Definite appeal, a gourmet edge, peach flesh is very apparent along with an attractive lift through the finish. Good wine, enjoyable, from an excellent producer. **Drink** 2019-2023 **Alc** 13.5%

### BLAYE CÔTES DE BORDEAUX

# Château le Virou Sublimus 2016 92

70% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon, 15% Cabernet Franc. You feel the ambition both in the colour and the texture, deep stately purple, and a rich well reflected body. It's good, it works, this has a lovely raspberry back cherry fruit, not overly sweet, well extracted and the tannins are fine and present but not drying. Good quality. **Drink** 2020-2028 **Alc** 14.5%

### Château Vieux Planty 2016 92

£13 Bibendum Wine

100% Merlot. This is dark ruby red in colour, with clear damson fruit on the nose. Good value for a wine with plenty of personality - the fruit is upfront but not overly sweet, there has clearly been some oak finessing and touches of patisserie flavours, but also a lovely silky texture. A lovely 36ha estate that does some fun food and wine tourism programmes. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### Château Puynard Cabernet **Sauvignon 2016** 92

£28 Bottle Apostle

100% Cabernet Sauvignon. Owned by the Bottle Apostle British owners, happy to see this here and interesting to see the blend (or lack of). very much like the nose, Well defined sexy black fruits, easily one of my favourites here, gourmet but still keeping. A savoury egg, good Cabernet Sauvignon finesse, Lovely lift through the palate. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### **Clos de Bonnange 2016** 91-92

85% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec. Get some peanut on the nose here, perhaps just reductive. It does clear, and I checked a 2nd bottle also. Darker spice and fruit register than most in the appellation and vintage - more black cherry, bilberry, cassis, with clearly silky texture that corresponds to a slightly higher alcohol content (or feeling). It's good quality, takes its time to unfurl through the glass. The glass bottle is heavy they are clearly signalling their intent. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14.5% ➤

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### Château Le Lion d'Or 2016 91

### £13.99 Averys Wine Merchant

100% Merlot. Raspberry and blueberry fruits, good structure and body, clear ripeness to the fruits but with an attractive savoury edge that suggests it hasn't been pushed too hard during ageing. Good quality with some classicism, and good value. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 12.5%

### Domaine des Graves d'Ardonneau **Prestige 2016** 91

€10

80% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Malbec. Again, the one-two punch of ripe dark fruits and vanilla. This has a lovely texture to the body, and good depth and spice to the blackberry fruit, well handed, great signature of the vintage, like this very much. My issue with the Côtes is that they can become a little too similar, even in the best years, they are obviously thinking about the consumer, which of course should not be a negative thing. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14.5%

# Château Bonnange 2016 90-91

90% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. Touch of reduction on the first nose, needs a good swirl and a minute or so in the glass. It clears, and this is enjoyable, smoky tar edges to the black fruits, good quality and nicely balanced, powerful and intense without being overdone. **Drink** 2020-2028 **Alc** 14.5%

### Château Mayne Mazerolles 2016 90-91

€7.50 Hallgarten Wines

80% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Malbec. Redcurrant and raspberry fruit on the nose, nicely balanced, there is a good balance of freshness, fruit and tannin here, with a ripeness that doesn't feel overdone or sought out through additions in the cellar. Unfussy, uncomplicated, good quality. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### La Confidence de Château Bois-Vert **2016** 90-91

€15.80

70% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec. Gourmet patisserie feeling on the aromatics, going for international impact. I can see the ambition, and they just about carry it off - certainly at this price bracket, you are showcasing that the Côtes have some slicks, well tired out wines, with a lick of stone and slate.

**Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

# Château Cap Saint Martin 2017 90

### £12.50 Averys Wine Merchant

80% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon. 2017 at this point and onwards. Intense aromatics straight off the first nose, damson sweetness, good weight to the palate, keeps things powering forward with a sense of freshness through the core, good quality, approachable but with a sense of restraint and deftness. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château Chamaille 2016 90

### £25 Freixenet Copestick

100% Merlot. Ruby red body, with a gentle cedar and smoked hickory edge to the nose. Gentle tannins, red fruits, clear sweetness with some vanilla bean, this is ready to drink and easy to approach. On clay-limestone slopes, owned by Vignobles Glemet. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### Château Haut Grelot Coteaux de Methez 2017 90

### £16 Bancroft Wines Ltd

100% Merlot, takes a heartbeat before getting going, and is all the better for it: not trying to hard, convinces you with a murmur not a shout, clean and ripe black fruits, nicely placed tannins are already yielding but giving a sense of being held together; Enjoyable wine. Drink 2019-2026 Alc 13.5%

### Château La Carelle 2016 90

£13.50 L'ami Jac

60% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Franc, 10% Malbec. Rich colour with some attractive spice notes. A good balance here between tannic structure and smooth black cherry fruits. A touch tight on the finish but plenty to enjoy along the way. Drink 2019-2026 Alc 14%



### Château Haut Prieur 2017 90

### £10 Direct Wines Ltd

90% Merlot, 10% Malbec. The dark spice of Malbec apparent in the colour and from the first nose. Soft tanning despite that, which makes this highly appealing and a good balance of fruit and freshness. It has a kick of sanity also on the finish, good quality for the price. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### Château La Raz Caman 2016 90

55% Merlot, 20% Malbec, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Petit Verdot. Clear potential here. Dark ruby red in colour with violet reflections. Some oak swirls on the nose, not too overpowering but clear finessing and ambition. Same thing on the palate - finesse, silky texture, touches of spice. Feels confident and approachable. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### Château Le Virou Vieilles Vignes 2017 90 £12.95

70% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon, 15% Cabernet Franc. Another good quality wine. This has liquorice, black chocolate, damson, all the ticks for a wine that delivers a slick overall package. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château Mélignan 2016 90

€13.50

50% Merlot, 40% Malbec, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. Like the nose here again, easy to say that these are as a whole good quality and speak well of the quality of the vintage; soft, silky, nicely integrated tannins, fruit and acidity. Cassis and brambles fruits, some smoked edging. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

# Château Montfollet le Valentin 2017 90

70% Merlot, 30% Malbec. Good depth to the fruit, black cherry, and swirling with rosemary and black pepper spice. Good value, potential. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

# Tutiac Lion and the Lily Réserve 2016 90

Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon. The use of oak is a little clumsy on the nose, although it does soften after a moment, and there is an attractively restrained balance of blackberry, cassis and patisserie cream. Ambitious, not in fact overblown once you give it a minute to relax, perhaps this is one that could do with another year in bottle. **Drink** 2020-2028 **Alc** 12.5%



### Château Bourdieu N°1 2016 89-90

Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec. The nose here has ripe cherry fruits, touches of black chocolate and dark spice, vanilla on the finish with liquorice overtones. A little overdone, but has ambition and potential. Should have another 5 to 8 years ahead of it. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 15%

### Château Barbé 2016 89

£13.50 L'ami Jac

75% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec. This has an enjoyable balance of spice, fruit and freshness, and holds itself back on the attack, taking a minute to breathe before unfurling. Tannins are well integrated, and the wine is ready to drink, although clearly has another five or six years ahead. The oak impact becomes clearer after a few minutes in the glass, but you are getting good quality and a window into 2016 potential. Good stuff from owner Xavier Carreau. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

# Château Bellevue Amphorae 2016 89

100% Merlot. Aged in amphoras, with a wax seal and heavy glass. Again touches of reduction on the nose, this has a nice weight to the fruit, and clear juiciness, feels less slick than some and all the better for it, but does take a minute to get used to, get touches of stalky. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 15%

### Château du Grand Barrail Prestige **2017** 89

### £15.15 Oxford & Cambridge Wine Club

80% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon. A little stewed on the nose, the fruit is clearly ripe, black cherry, blackberry, all about the brambles and the hedgerow, which I very much like, but not as crisply defined as some. Drink 2019-2026 Alc 13.5%

### Château La Petite Roque 2017 89

### £11.15 Daniel Lambert Wines Ltd

Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon. A little bit squeezed through the mid palate, could find better for the price I would say, but it does settle into itself through the glass, and again shows that at this price in this category in 2016 threes an awful lot to enjoy. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13%

### Château Les Chaumes Vieilles Vignes 2016 89

€10

70% Merlot, 30% Malbec. Gourmet vanilla bean on the nose, followed up with damson fruits on the palate. It puts the brakes on before it becomes too much, and there is a sweetness from the ripe fruit that steals up on you. Good. Drink 2019-2026 Alc 13.8%

### Château Monconseil-Gazin 2017 89

£9.50 The Wine Society

Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec. A kick of gourmet creme patisserie, black cherry and liquorice, sweet almonds, this is good in fact, has a silky texture and is modern but not overdone. Enjoyable, approachable, no need to think too hard. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13%

### Château Pardaillan 2016 89

### £13.50 L'ami Jac

90% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec. Attractively vibrant ruby colour, and a nose that is fruity and approachable without being confected. Tightens a little too much though the mid palate, but the juiciness to the fruit comes in to bring it home. Enjoyable. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

# Château Terre Blanque Noémie 2016 89

80% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon. Firm raspberry and cherry fruits, structure without evident tannins. Nicely balanced with silky texture, again the vanilla edging a little too much but caught by the ripe fruit. This is pretty much ready to go but feels like it has enough life and sustenance in it to last for another five or six years.

### **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14.5%

### Château Tour Saint Germain Elégance **2017** 89

65% Merlot, 25% Malbec, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. The more interesting of the two cuvées on display for me - this has spice and depth, enjoyable. Black fruits, firm tannins, a little austere but good.

### **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13%

Délice de Château Dubraud 2016 89

90% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. Classic damson and vanilla nose, but with a sense of restraint, well handled aromatically. Just a little too sweet on the attack, the vanilla clamps around the fruit, although things ease off again and there is a good juice and integrity to the fruit Promising. Drink 2019-2026 Alc 13%

# CADILLAC CÔTES DE BORDEAUX

### Château Biac 2016 93

£40 Brompton Wine

42% Merlot, 34% Cabernet Sauvignon, 13% Cabernet Franc, 11% Petit Verdot. Smoked cedar traces on the nose, then a subtle but clear delivery of black fruits and spice. There is plenty of impact here, the wine takes its time to open, forces you to slow down and take note of the different layers of flavour. An excellent wine to look out for, one of the true quality names among the Côtes. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14.5% ➤

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### Château la Rame 2017 91 £10 Majestic

60% Merlot, 40% Cabernet Sauvignon. Impressively structured without being overblown, I like the push and pull through the palate of silky Merlot fruits, with some grip and backbone. Enjoyable. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château Le Dovenne 2016 91

£20 Berry Bros, Adnams

75% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Cabernet Franc. Nudges open in the glass, taking its time then showing a richly sweet edge to the fruit. Lovely dark ruby colour, well balanced, nicely judged, firm but ripe black cassis and blackberry fruits, hedgerow traces without being underripe. Enjoyable. Michel Rolland consultant. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### Château Réaut Carat 2017 91

£24 Laithwaite's Wines

70% Cabernet Franc, 15% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon. A stir of grilled cedar and damson, going for gloss and pretty much pulling it off. A little overly sweet but with an appetising sense of welcome and balanced by a core of freshness. Good job in the vintage, as is true for their main bottling Château Réaut (that I gave 90 points to, but didn't include here so as to free up room for other producers). **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### Château Reynon 2016 91

75% Merlot, 17% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Petit Verdot. High percentage of Petit Verdot for the appellation, and it lends a beautifully aromatic spice to the wine. Denis Dubourdieu's home estate, and fitting to have such a lovely result in what was his last vintage. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

# Château Suau L'Artolie 2016 90-91

100% Merlot. Some brushed damson tal and vanilla bean, has good impact, Good value, a little sweet but plenty of enjoy, good grip and good Cotes typicity. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### B de Château Biac 2016 90

£40 Brompton Wine

Cabernet Sauvignon. Touch of reduction on the first nose, needs a good minute or so in the glass. Heavy glass bottle not the most environmentally-friendly, but signals its intent to be taken seriously, and to be it honest it pulls it off once you give it a minute or so. A little smoky, with some bite, some lift, good definition to the fruit, a clear success for this 2nd wine. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14.5%

94% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc, 1%

### Château Clos Chaumont 2016 90

75% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Sauvignon. Intense colour, from a Dutch-owned estate that I always enjoy, particularly as it has good consistency across vintages. The ambition is clear here, as is the lovely bounce to those tannins than some. Firm fruits and well structured, give it another year in bottle or a good hour in a decanter before drinking. Hubert de Bouard consultant. Drink 2020-2030 **Alc** 14%

# Château de Potiron Excellence 2016 90

70% Merlot, 27% Cabernet Sauvignon, 3% Cabernet Franc. As is so often the case in this vintage, it's texture that impresses. The weight of the fruit presses down through the body of the wine, and it is cradled but not strangled by the tannins. Plenty to get your hands round in this glass. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château du Cros Coteaux de Lou 2016 90 €16.90

95% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Sauvignon.

Good quality, unforced, well balanced, clear dark fruit flavours. An enjoyable wine from Catherine d'Halluin, whose family own the always excellent Château du Cros. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château Manos 2016 90

€10

60% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc. Touches of vanilla patisserie here, giving a gourmet twist to the cassis and bilberry fruits. Côtes wines always works best when they don't feel like they are trying too hard, and they are doing a great job with that here, even while adding some touches of oak finesse. Drink 2019-2026 Alc 13.5%

### Château Lamothe de Haux 2017 90 £14 **RDW**

60% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc. Good aromatics if a little subdued, opens up to reveal dark chocolate and cocoa dusting. Clear spices, and an estate that has good consistency, a name to look out for. Also enjoyed their Première Cuvée from the same vintage (same score also). **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château Suau 2016 90

€14

70% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc. Good aromatics. then the fruit takes a heartbeat before kicking in on the palate. Subtle at first, but opens very prettily to show brambled blackcurrant and berry fruits. Organic since 2008. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14%

### Château Ricaud Grand Vin 2016 89-90 €19.50

78% Cabernet Sauvignon, 16% Merlot, 6% Petit Verdot. Subtle, takes a heartbeat before kicking in. This is subdued, but once open shows dark fruits, blackcurrant, blackberry, slate and liquorice. Drink 2019-2026 Alc 14%

# Château Clos Chaumont Une Passion

€22

75% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Cabernet Franc. Good quality wine, but tight right now and needs a little longer in bottle. Lovely silky quality to the texture, enjoyable. **Drink** 2020-2028 **Alc** 15%

### Château de Marsan 2016 89

70% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon. Clear oak edging, cedar and a highly smoked hickory feel. I like the fruit placement, it is firm and juicy, a little contemporary sure but good côtes signature, which goes for the slick modern feel often, mainly in Castillon but can work in Cadillac also! **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château des Mille Anges 2016 89

€13 Goedhuis

70% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon. Lovely vibrant reflections on the colour here, violet and ruby. The tannins are a little chewy but the wine feels beautifully unfussy with focus on natural juicy fruits. Enjoyable stuff from owner Heather van Ekris. 33% new oak, Hubert de Bouard consultant. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château Le Giron 2016 89

60% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc. Vibrant brambly fruits, well pace through the palate, nicely extracted, juicy and not overly pushed. Highly drinkable. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 13.5%

### Château Les Guyonnets Héritage **2016** 89

€9.50

100% Merlot. Firm black fruits, a kick of salinity on the finish, good quality unforced. **Drink** 2019-2023 **Alc** 13.5%

# Château Pilet Alt 120 mètres 2016 89

100% Cabernet Sauvignon. Firm redcurrant and raspberry fruits, just slightly wisps of rusticity as it travels through the palate. Good texture and weight, there is plenty of enjoyment to be had here. **Drink** 2019-2024 **Alc** 14%



# Château La Clarière Laithwaite 2016

€25.90 Laithwaite's Wines

75% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Cabernet Franc, 5% Malbec. Deep and rich, this really is a very nice bottle of wine. Well handled, complex and concentrated but not overblown. Easily one of the best in the line up in terms of quality and approachability - a good advert for what Castillon can do. Back chocolate, liquorice, slate, firm tannins, voung but not totally closed up, and with clear ageing potential. Good stuff from Laithwaites. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14.5%

### Château Alcée 2016 92

£20 BI Wine

92% Merlot, 8% Cabernet Franc. Like this, feels like it has been carefully laid out, fruit first, with layers carefully laid over of tannin, liquorice, oak, slate. Good quality, good persistency. From the Nicolas Thiepont stable, so you are also getting excellent winemaking knowledge here, suggesting you can be pretty confident in its ability to age for a good few years. **Drink** 2019-2026 **Alc** 14.5%

## Château Joanin Bécot 2016 92

£14.50 Berry Bros & Rudd
